Why do playgrounds matter?

Play is a critical part of the social, emotional, cognitive and physical development of every child. Unfortunately, the vast majority of playgrounds deny children with disabilities and critical illnesses the opportunity for exercise, entertainment and social interactions which other children enjoy. In fact, only a small percentage of fully accessible playgrounds exist within our nation and these are insufficient to serve 43 million Americans with disabilities.

An **Inclusive Playground** is specifically designed to remove physical and social barriers so ALL children, with and without disabilities and/ or critical illnesses, can play side by side with their peers and families.

To be located in Kewaskum, WI this playground will be an Unlimited Play inclusive playground — a place where limitations will be forgotten and differences are celebrated!

THE VISION

Our mission is to create a safe, welcoming and accessible play environment where children of all abilities can engage, explore, and connect. We aim to ensure that every child can play without boundaries.

Kewaskum is an area that is surrounded by the stunning Kettle Moraine, which consists of rolling hills, beautiful landscapes and abundant wildlife. Countless generations have grown up visiting the parks in our community, and cherished memories made over the years. We look forward to continuing to create new memories together as we build an all-abilities playground, where everyone can play, connect, and grow.

Baylor, born on May 9th, 2016, was diagnosed shortly after with Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA), a genetic condition causing progressive muscle loss. Despite no cure, therapies are now available. Unfortunately, Baylor had the most severe form of SMA, and these therapies weren't yet accessible. He passed away at 3 months old due to SMA complications. Baylor's infectious smile and love for nature will never be forgotten. In his memory, we take his younger brothers to all-abilities playgrounds, as many affected by SMA have disabilities, including potential wheelchair use. By visiting these playgrounds, we teach our kids to understand and accept everyone's differences. It's vital to us that every child can play without limitations. We believe that all playgrounds should consider every child. This playground honors our son Baylor and will continue to do so for future generations. It's where Baylor's spirit shines, connecting kids and families with love.

Melissa is a mom to three boys. She and her husband, Matt, recently welcomed twins, Riley and Merritt, to their family. Their oldest son, Morgan, was born in June 2021 and spent his life at Children's Wisconsin due to complex medical needs. Living at the hospital alongside Morgan for 82 days opened their eyes to so much—first, how the support of medical professionals, friends, family, and community members not only made a difference in their lives but also allowed them to be fully present for Morgan every second they had with him. And second, how medical challenges reshape families, often making something as simple as play feel out of reach.

Though his life was filled with challenges, Morgan was pure joy. In his short time earthside, and through the people he brought into their lives, he taught Melissa and Matt that the greatest thing we can do for each other is reach out a hand to help. The all-abilities playground is one way they are doing just that—"playing it forward" by helping the Creekside Camp Committee create a space where every child in Kewaskum and Washington County, regardless of ability, can experience the joy of play and truly be included.

The Schotzko Family

Our sweet Reagan's journey began when she was diagnosed with Hypoplastic Left Heart Syndrome (HLHS), a congenital heart defect, at our 20-week ultrasound. This condition is typically treated with a series of three open-heart surgeries. At just three days old, Reagan underwent her first surgery, and doctors soon told us her best chance for survival would be a heart transplant. After six long months, Reagan received a new heart and was able to go home just 20 days post-transplant.

Since then, Reagan has made incredible progress and continues to reach new milestones. However, for her, milestones aren't just about developmental growth; they also include regular echocardiograms, yearly heart catheterizations, daily medications, and ongoing lab tests to prevent rejection. While these procedures are essential for her health, they also come with risks that can impact Reagan's growth, development, and cognitive abilities.

As Reagan continues to thrive, we've realized the importance of supporting all families, no matter their child's ability. Children with varying needs deserve the opportunity to play, grow, and experience the joy of being included, no matter what challenges they may face.

We believe in the power of inclusion, and we know that creating a space for all children to thrive will have a profound impact on our entire community.

Jake and Kelsey have both grown up in Kewaskum, attended Kewaskum schools, and are active members of the community. They now have two kids, Bennett and Mackenzie, who will also grow up in Kewaskum. Having an all-inclusive playground in Kewaskum would not only allow opportunities for kids with varying abilities, but for her kids to be provided with more opportunities to interact and include them in their everyday activities.




